Food and Service charge

£100 per person. This includes food (starting from Thursday dinner, through Monday lunch) and Service Charge (a small contribution towards running costs).

Participants pay a non-refundable deposit of 20% when booking and the remainder by two weeks before the experience week.

Please note that this **does not** include accommodation costs.

Accommodation

We offer various accommodation opportunities on site (prices are per night):

- Converted bus: £20 for single and £30 for a couple;
- The Shack: £25 for single and £35 for a couple;
